Mountaincraft and Leadership, by Eric Langmuir Review by Michael Murphy

The <u>British Mountain Training</u> program has been responsible for training and assessing mountain guides for decades. These guides lead expeditions into every conceivable environment, from the lowlands of Dartmoor to the Himalayas, and encounter the most brutal conditions that nature has to offer. <u>Mountaincraft and Leadership</u> is their bible.

Written by Eric Langmuir in 1984, "*Mountaincraft*" is now in its 4th edition. It has been updated with modern scientific knowledge, advanced recommendations, and incorporates modern exploration technology. The book is written in very plain English with very little fluff, loads of illustrations, and an easy to navigate format. It scaffolds skill building intuitively, so that any novice can finish the book an

adept explorer, with at least a baseline of emergency and survival information at hand. Chapters include: Navigation, Hillwalking Technique, Campcraft and Expeditions, Food and Nutrition, Access and Conservation, Security on Steep Ground, River Crossing, Mountain Weather, Mountain Hypothermia, Effects of Heat, First Aid, Incident Management and Mountain Rescue, Party Leadership, Technique on Snow and Ice, Security on Snow and Ice, Snow and Avalanches and Cold Injury.

As explorers, our expeditions take us to remote locations. We can anticipate that emergencies will happen and help will be far away. It is essential for explorers to have the basic skills to plan a trip with these in mind, prepare contingencies, lead a team, recognize dangers, and—if the worst should happen be able to articulately navigate rough conditions and injuries. In my mind, there is no better resource for training in everything from navigation and campcraft to avalanches and injuries.
