## **James's Expedition**

James Kempton, the Exploration Club Chairman, will be traveling to Indonesia in December, during the Christmas Vacation. He will spend time in Jakarta, on the island of Java, and in Jayapura and the Cyclops Mountains, on the island of New Guinea. These visits are part of a reconnaissance expedition in preparation for his summer 2023 expedition to the Cyclops Mountains. The summer expedition aims to discover new species to science, rediscover 'lost' species, and undertake research into the evolutionary biology of New Guinea's enigmatic fauna. James will meet important expedition partners during the reconnaissance expedition and, in visiting the Cyclops Mountains, he will scout potential base camps and routes up to the mountain peaks in preparation for the summer fieldwork.



## **Carla's Expedition**

Early next year, Carla V Fuenteslópez, former Exploration Club Chairwoman and our current Archivist & Secretary, will be leading the Oxford University Expedition to Príncipe island.

This unique place might even be "the only country in the world where precisely no archaeological fieldwork has yet been carried out" (Mitchell and Lunn-Rockliffe 2021).

The team - Bastiaan, Denise, Sophia & Carla - will conduct the first deep-time sediment coring on the island to understand the dynamics of environmental change on the island and the influence of human occupation, perform contemporary biodiversity surveys in

marine & terrestrial ecosystems, and share the stories and experiences of Principe's people. The expedition will also be featured in a documentary.
